



Dear Southern California,

It is time for summer camp!! Fallbrook Pony Club is excited to host 2009's Southern California Pony Club Summer Camp. It is a whole new summer camp this year, with great programs designed for, and structured around, the pony clubbers. Here are the particulars:

Camp is going to be held from Wednesday afternoon, July 15 through Saturday, July 18, with a mega-rating day Sunday, July 19. Camp is open to, and has instruction for, all levels of PCers. The field will open Wednesday morning for move-in and set up for horses and PCers. Wednesday afternoon's ride will be introductory and designed to make sure everyone has been placed in the correct group for the duration of camp. Wednesday night will be the welcome BBQ, which is open to families. Thursday, Friday and Saturday will include:

- Three meals per day with snacks and water available all day
- Two lessons per day (one lesson in the AM and one in the PM)
- One craft project per day
- One Horse Management session per day
- Mid-day swimming and relaxation at the home of Fallbrook PC's Barbara Speck
- Evening presentations from professionals in the equine field
- Traditional Saturday night slideshow showcasing all PCers at camp!

Pick-up of PCers not choosing to participate in the mega-rating will be Sunday morning. For those wishing to take a testing on Sunday, there will be D-1 through C-2 testings offered.

The cost of camp is as follows:

- \$360.00 per camper, not including a rating
- Price reduction of \$60 for attending a work day at Fallbrook Riders Field
- Price reduction of \$50 for bringing your own temporary pipe corral

The cost of the testings are as follows:

- \$30.00 per camper for a testing D1-D3
- \$50.00 per camper for a C1 or C2 testing

Rental corrals are \$10.00/night and are first come, first serve and are very limited. Any campers who can bring their own corrals will not have to pay this fee and will receive an additional price reduction in the camp fee.

Fallbrook does need a lot of man power to help get the field ready for camp. Therefore, we are holding a work day on June 14 at the Riders Field. Each volunteer who spends six hours working will receive a \$60 reduction in the price of camp. Work will begin at 8AM!

This year, pony club camp is about the PCers! Camping, as well as camp meals, are reserved for the campers and staff only. Each club is asked to send ONE chaperone for their club. Parents are welcome to come and watch camp lessons, but not to camp at the field. While the camp chaperone is welcome to bring an RV or horse trailer with living quarters (hook-ups are \$20 pr night and extremely limited), ***it is tent camping for all campers!*** If your chaperone plans to bring an RV, please contact me with the it's length and whether or not a hook-up is needed.

Because camp is expected to be full this summer, trailer parking will also be extremely limited, and therefore will be limited to one "tack trailer" per club for storage of feed, extra equipment, etc. It is recommended that each camper brings a trunk for outside their corral in which to keep tack and grooming supplies.
